They were warmly welcomed by all the schools, and so presented to them the information about tertiary level education, of the requirements to make it to a university and subjects one needs to study to pursue his/her career of passion, and also about the bursaries available to aid the students who do not have finances to further their studies. 


LUSIKISIKI TRIP (EASTERN CAPE)

This second MRYE trip took place between the 27th of March and the 2nd of April 2015. A team of nine members partook on the long trip to the rural Lusikisiki in the Eastern Cape Province, which is about 900 kilometres away from Pretoria, and they visited nine schools namely, Ntafufu, Ben Mali, Hillbrow, Toli, Mgezwa, Phambili, Mqikela, Sangoni, and Palmerton all of them were Senior Secondary Schools. The teachers were very happy for receive our team as we were warmly welcomed in most of the schools. And the leaners there were keen to receive the information, as the team experienced maximum participation from learners. In two of the schools they presented to more than eight hundred learners at assembly.









TEMBISA (GAUTENG)

Towards the end of May, MRYE was invited by their former Chairperson Mr Aaron Mabaso to a school he teaches Umqhele Secondary School. It was a short trip also. They were warmly welcomed by the principal of the school. And all the presentations were a success even though it was a short notice. Mr Sithembiso Khumalo and Miss Slindile Zulu, who are also former Chairpersons of MRYE were present throughout the presentations and they did help with motivating learners who were very enthusiastic and eagerly listened to the presentations without making loud noise and causing distractions. The trip was also a success.



NQUTHU (KWAZULU-NATAL)

During the June-July recess MRYE once again embarked on a trip to Nqutu in the rural of KwaZulu-Natal. It was a long trip that took place from the 04th to the 11th of July 2015. A team of twelve members went there. They visited eighteen schools, namely, Mzilankatha, Mangeni, Springlake, Ngwane, Mgazi, Ubongumenzi (2015 MRYE Chairperson's former secondary school), Leneha Tumisi, Funulwazi, Msimbu, Nomdumo, Zicole, Ekucabangeni, Velaphansi, Ukuphumula, and Sicelimfundo. Everything went well, and all the presentations were successful, though they had faced some challenges here and there, but everything came out to be a victory. They overcame the challenges and so the trip was also a success after all.





O NORTH-WEST TRIP

On the 01 October 2015, a group of 10 members took part on the trip to North West. The team was expected to come back from North West on the 07 October and then set a short trip to Makapanstad on the 08 October 2015. But then the Makapanstad trip had to be cancelled as the schools they had communicated and arranged with pulled out. In the North West, they presented on the schools individually and also in groups at different 'Spring School' camps arranged for the students that are

not doing so well in their studies. A total number of 23 schools had the privilege to receive information from MRYE.

After the trip, this is what the head-organizer of the trip, Sylvester Phalane had to say: "This was the first trip I was organizing. It was challenging and it was also a learning experience." The trip, like all the other trips for 2015, was a huge success.





4. PLANS FOR 2016

The mission have not changed. We are still looking forward to empowering the youth of South Africa so that they have a tool (information) which they need to make informed decisions; as stated by our Mission Statement. We are looking forward to attracting more and more people to the organisation. So, awareness around different campuses is one of our primary goals. We want as many people as possible to be granted the MRYE membership. We are currently working on the strategies we can use to market our organisation which I honestly believe it does much, but most students are not aware that it exists. The provinces that we could not visit this year, are our main priority for 2016 as we aim for balanced influence across the country.
